James H Stipp vs James R. Parker

This deals with some property and mortgage on said property. It appears to have been closing out the agreement made between the two people. The property : the undivided on half of twenty two feet and eight inches off the east side of lot no. one hundred and eight (108) in the town of Canton, county of Fulton, State of Illinois. The proceedings stretched from 1849 to 1853. This would indicate that James was still living in Fulton county in 1853. In the proceedings, Anny is mentioned, also Jacob Parker signed and a Mary Parker. Jacob is most likely James and Anna's son. Mary unknown, their daughter is only five at the time of the first paper, 1849. Could it be Maria or some other unknown Mary. Couldn't find one that would be of legal age in 1849 except for Maria.
